- **14. Ginkgo** *Ginkgo biloba* **E**Native to China with distinctive fan-shaped leaves and prized autumn foliage.
- **15. Seven-Son Flower –** Heptacodium miconioides **E**Discovered in China in 1907. Seven tiny creamy-white flowers appear in whorls.
- **16. Saucer Magnolia –** *Magnolia soulangeana* **E**Deciduous magnolia with fragrant pink flowers on a bare tree in early spring.
- **17.** Variegated Dogwood 'Wolf Eyes' Cornus kousa E Beautiful small tree with eye-catching, wavy-green leaves accented with ivory margins.
- **18. Pin Oak –** Quercus palustris **N**Unusual branching pattern and deeply lobed leaves.
- 19. Katsura Tree Cercidiphyllum japonicum E Native to Japan and China. Noted for its heart shaped leaves and showy autumn foliage.
- **20. Japanese White Pine –** *Pinus parviflora* **E** Dense pine with spreading branches and cones.
- 21. Weeping Norway Spruce Picea abies 'Pendula' E Pyramidal evergreen native to northern and central Europe.
- 22. Cucumber Magnolia Magnolia acuminata N Deciduous magnolia with fragrant, tulip-like flowers and cucumber-like fruits.
- 23. Bald Cypress Taxodium distichum N

  A large, slow-growing deciduous conifer which, unlike most cone-bearing trees, loses its needles each winter and grows a new set in the spring. Known for its distinctive "knees", which are structures of the root system that rise above the ground as an extension of the root.
- **24.** Dawn Redwood Metasequoia glyptostroboides **E** 

  One of the few cone-bearing deciduous trees.
- **25.** Loebner Magnolia Magnolia x lobneri 'Merrill' E

  Native to Japan with showy white flowers that resemble stars in early spring.
- 26. American Holly Ilex opaca N Upright evergreen with lower branches close to the ground.
- **27. Oriental Spruce** *Picea orientalis* **E**Evergreen with short ascending branches that extend to the ground.
- 28. Japanese Stewartia Stewartia pseudocamellia E 
  Unusual bark produces a camouflaged appearance of dull orange, green and gray.
- **29.** Tuliptree Liriodendron tulipifera **N**One of the tallest native broadleaf trees with leaves that recall a tulip flower in profile.

- **30.** Yoshino Cherry Prunus x yedoensis E
  Flowering hybrid cherry with fragrant flowers.
  A gift from Japan to the United States in 1912.
- **31.** American Hornbeam Carpinus caroliniana **N** Named for its hard whitish wood.
- **32. Sourwood** *Oxydendrum arboreum* **N** Glossy green leaves that turn yellow, red and purple in the fall.
- **33. Eastern Hemlock –** *Tsuga canadensis* **N** Needled evergreen with very short needles.
- **35. Paperbark Maple –** Acer griseum **E**Admired for its decorative bark and spectacular autumn foliage which can include red, orange, and pink tones.
- American Sweetgum Liquidambar styraciflua N
   Recognized by aromatic, star-shaped leaves and spring
   seed balls.
- **37. Kousa Dogwood –** *Cornus kousa* **E**Native to Eastern Asia, its flowers are extremely showy.
- **38.** Japanese Zelkova Zelkova serrata E

  Noted for its graceful shape, attractive bark, and its saw-tooth edged leaves.
- **39.** Manchurian Catalpa Catalpa bungei E

  Native to China, it is known for its striking white blossoms. After flowering it produces long, bean-like pods that dangle from its branches.
- **40. Kobus Magnolia –** *Magnolia kobus* **E** Noted for its winter to early spring goblet-shaped, fragrant, pink-tinged white flowers.
- **41. Eastern White Pine** *Pinus strobus* **N** Tall evergreen with layered branches.
- **42. Northern Red Oak –** *Quercus rubra* **N**New Jersey state tree with dark gray bark.
- **43. Mockernut Hickory** Carya tomentosa **N**Aromatic leaves turning bright yellow in the fall.
  Nuts are round or pear shaped.
- **44.** White Oak Quercus alba N
  Distinguished by its leaves with rounded lobes and acorns with shallow cups.
- **45. Nootka Cypress –** Chamaecyparis nootkatensis **N**Weeping, pyramidal evergreen with drooping sprays of bluish-green foliage.



- Edith Bogue Magnolia Magnolia grandiflora N
   Broadleaf evergreen noted for its dark green leaves and its large, fragrant flowers.
- Cornelian Cherry Dogwood Cornus mas E
   Native of Europe with yellow flowers that bloom in early spring in dense round clusters.
- Japanese Cedar Cryptomeria japonica E
   Evergreen with spiral branches, blue-green needles and rounded cones.

- Native tree of Japan with creamy-white bell-shaped flowers in late May to June.
- Eastern Redcedar Juniperus virginiana N
   Aromatic evergreen with spike-like crown.
- 7. Black Oak Quercus velutina N Dark grayish bark with large, dark green leaves with broad lobes.
- Chestnut Oak Quercus montana N
   Leaves with rounded lobes. Its acoms are among the largest of the oaks.
- Eastern Redbud Cercis canadensis N
   Pink flowers emerge before leaves in the spring.

- Cedar of Lebanon Cedrus libani E
   A stately tree with a thick, massive trunk and spreading branches.
- **11. Star Magnolia –** *Magnolia stellata* **E**Showy, fragrant white flowers that resemble stars in early spring.
- **12. Sweetbay Magnolia –** *Magnolia virginiana* **N** Aromatic with creamy-white flowers.
- **13.** Japanese Maple Acer palmatum E

  Small deciduous tree with leaves of five to seven pointed lobes.
