ABOUT

A Sculpture Trail features representative works from notable artists from around the country. Sculptures have been thoughtfully selected and creatively placed by our Curator, Scott A. Broadfoot (Broadfoot & Broadfoot, A Collection of Fine Art) with consideration to the varied plant life, water, topographical features and natural light in the park. Visitors will find that each season and even the variable weather in the northeast provide an interesting backdrop to these unique works of art.

PARTICIPATING ARTISTS

There have been 17 notable artists who participated in this project, each of whom can boast of a rich and diverse portfolio of work, education and experience. The artists range in age, gender, and geographic region. A variety of mediums like natural stone, clay, metals and acrylic have been used to create these unique sculptures.

Laurelwood Arboretum is located at 725 Pines Lake Drive West in Wayne, NJ. The arboretum is open and free to the public, every day, 8 am to dusk, except during emergency conditions. Public parking lots are located through the open gates on Vale Road and Pines Lake Drive West.

The Knippenberg Center for Education is located near the parking lots with accessible parking adjacent to the building. The center is open April through October, noon to 4 pm Tuesdays through Sundays except during emergency conditions. Accessible bathrooms are available when the building is open.

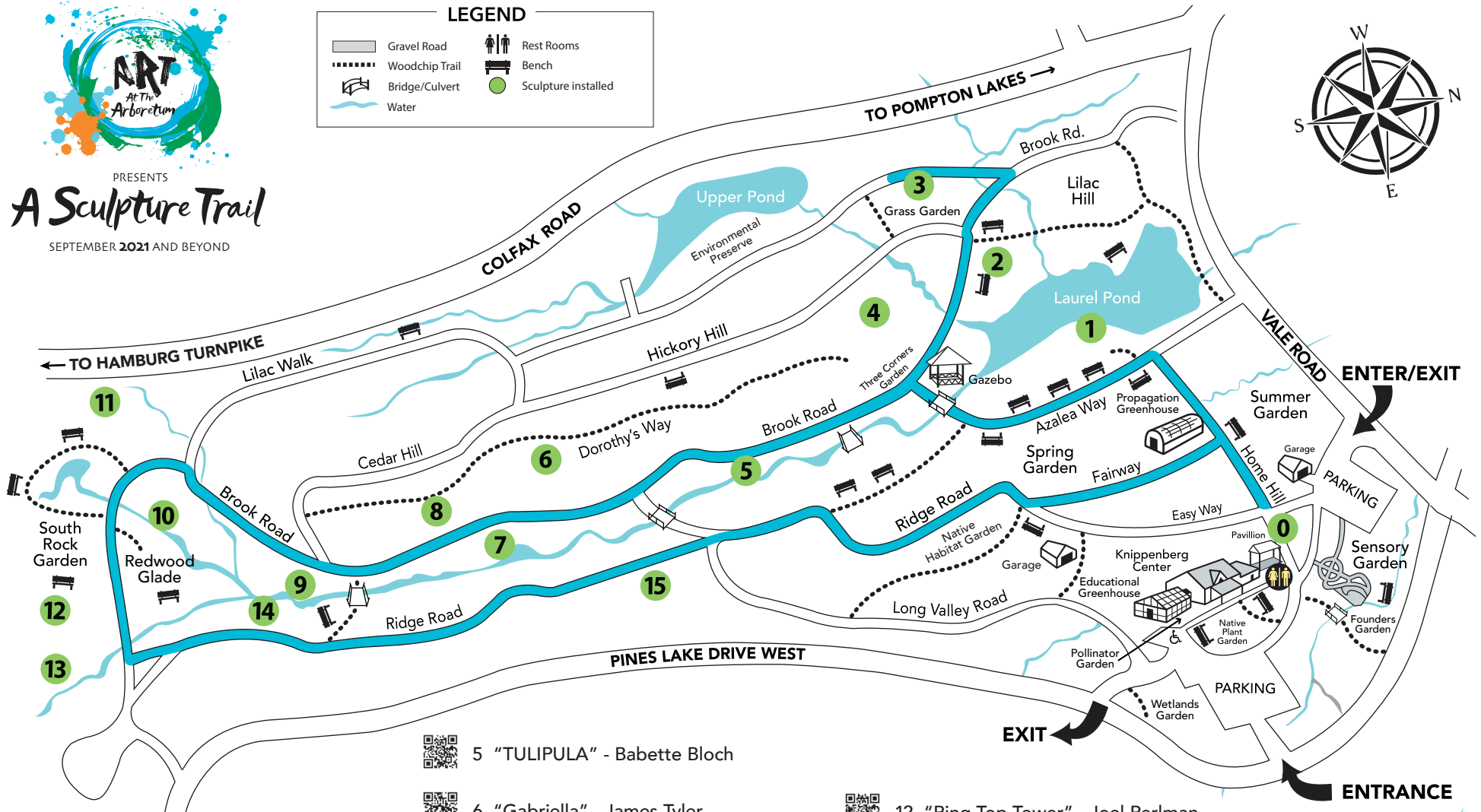

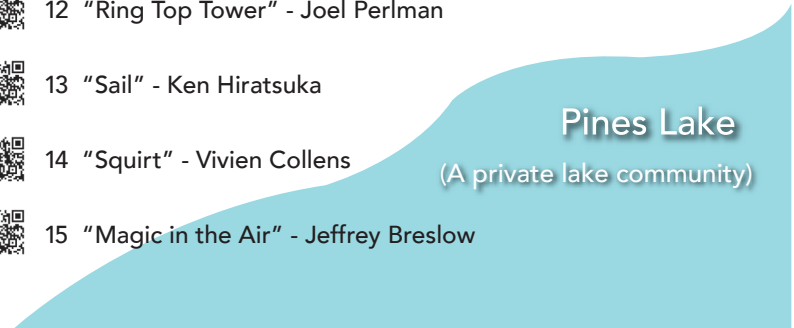
